Te Haeata was established in June 2008 to negotiate the best historical claims settlement deal for Ngati Porou. In December 2010 we signed a comprehensive deal with the Crown. It included a putea of 123 million dollars, the purchasing of two local forests – Tokomaru and Ruatoria, the return of 6000 hectares of Ngati Porou whenua that the Department of Conservation had and a letter of commitment with National Library, National Archives and Te Papa Tongarewa.

Since 2008 I have been part of a team that travelled the motu and provided comprehensive communications about



the settlement package to our rohe and taurahere.

A vote for me is a vote for a ringa raupa committed to realising the aspirations of all our marae and hapu in our rohe.
